### Principal Matters

4.2 Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> October 2023

### What?

Holding up a cricket bat, I said: 'Students, this is a tennis racquet."

Holding up a pencil, I said: 'This is an eraser."

Holding up a blue card, I said: 'This is the colour red."

The students were really confused and couldn't make much sense of what was going on.

Students were asked to consider a simple thought experiment: What would it be like to go to a school where teachers didn't tell the truth? How would you learn things if you couldn't be sure if you could trust what teachers said?

We soon concluded that unless students could absolutely trust teachers to tell them the truth, we wouldn't have much of a school.

Just like we must know that teachers are truthful, it is just as important for students to tell the truth as well. What would it be like to come to a school where no one could be sure whether anyone was being honest?

Telling the truth is not always easy, especially if something wrong has happened. We all acknowledged that this was a challenge, but that in the end, we all must aim to be honest all the time at school so that we can be confident to trust each other and build a culture of mutual respect.

The years 3—6 class have been producing ocean-inspired artworks in coloured chalk, acrylics and collage


